- Localised, data-driven research is essential for practical interventions

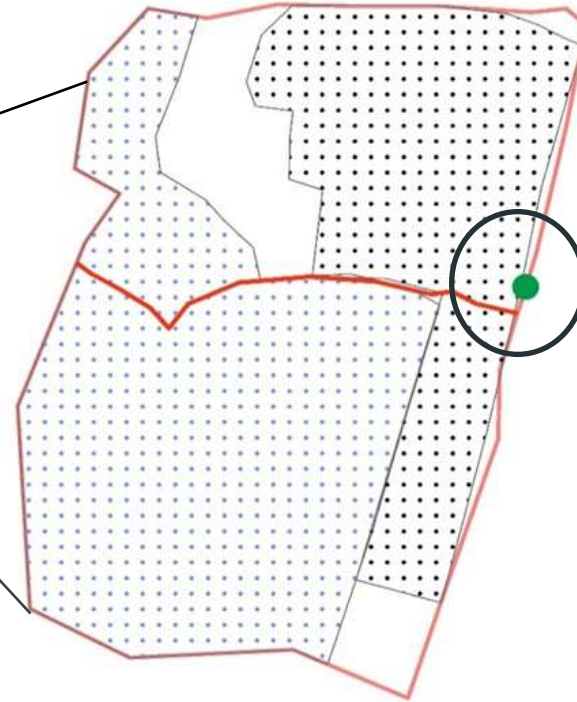

-  Hatcliffe

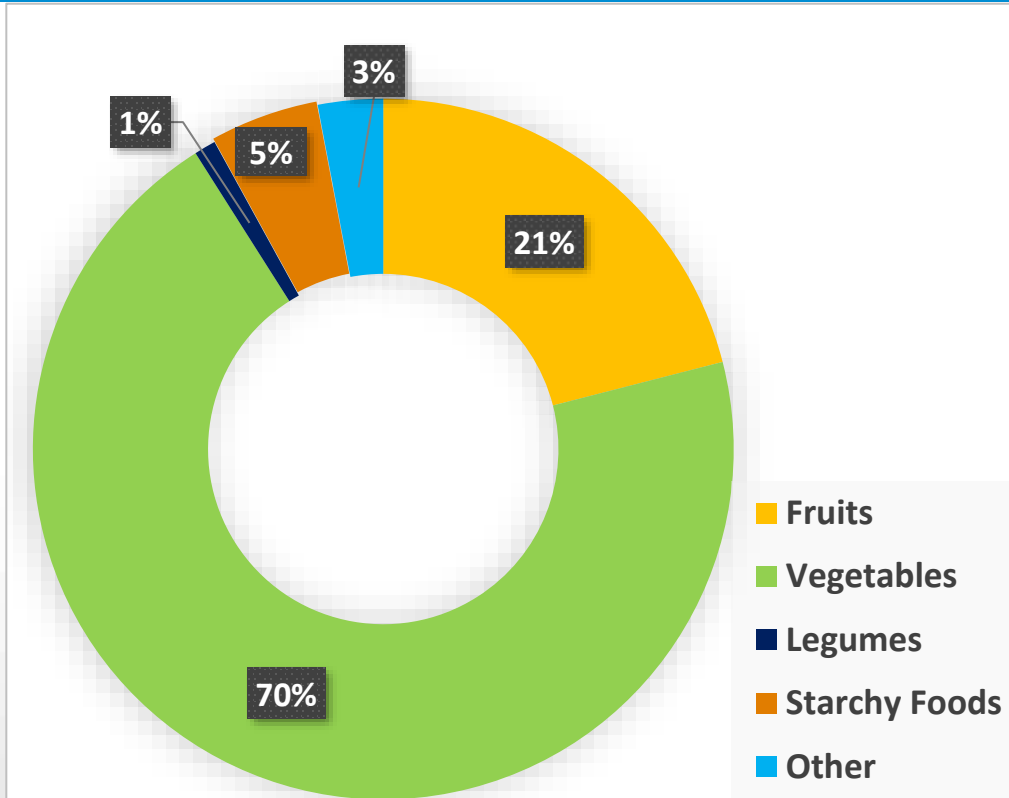
Methods used to collect data

7-day Kitchen Diary Survey	✗	✓
7-day Waste Composition Analysis (food waste mass)	✓	✓
Questionnaire Survey	✓	✓

Street Market Food Waste



Results: Street Market Food Waste Composition



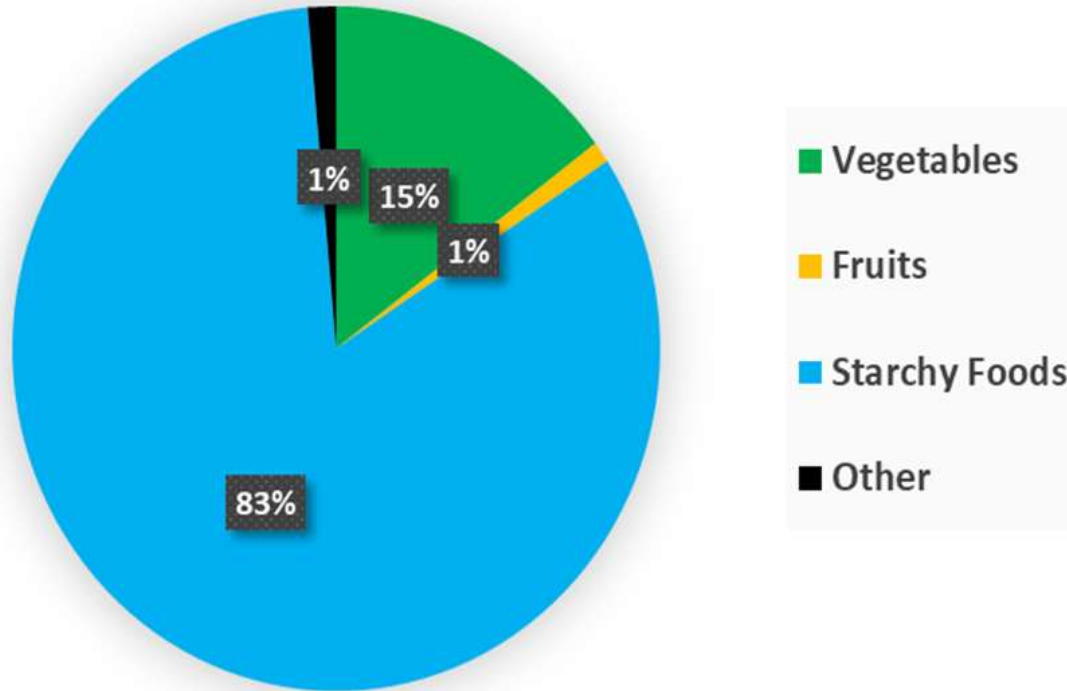

- **13.21 kg** average food waste per stall per week
- **83 %** was avoidable food waste
- **Inadequate infrastructure and vendor practices drive street market food waste**

Household Food Waste



Findings: Household Food Waste Composition



- 3.17 kg average food waste per Household per week
- 59% avoidable food waste
- Cultural norms of preparing & serving too much food and discarding leftovers contribute to household food waste

Results: Avoidable food waste from households

- Consists mainly of leftovers from cooked food
- **Starchy Foods:** *sadza* 71% (thick maize porridge), rice, bread & baked goods, pasta
- **Vegetables:** tomatoes, leafy greens, cabbage
- **Fruits:** Bananas
- **Others:** meat, beans

- Awareness campaigns: collaborations of schools, universities, and research institutions
- Develop and improve infrastructure at the street markets: low-cost technologies
- Include indigenous knowledge in food waste reduction initiatives
- Train vendors and smallholder farmers on proper product handling
