JIRCAS's Mission


- 1. Undertakes comprehensive research of agriculture, forestry, fisheries and related industries in developing regions

History

- 1970 Tropical Agriculture Research Center (TARC) was established under the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) of Japan
- 1993 TARC was re-organized into the Japan International Research Center for Agricultural Sciences (JIRCAS).
- 2001 JIRCAS became an Incorporated Administrative Agency under the jurisdiction of MAFF.
- 2011 Start of 3rd Medium-Term Plan
- 2015 JIRCAS became a National Research and Development Agency under the jurisdiction of MAFF
- 2016 Start of 4th Medium-Term Plan
- (2020 50th Anniversary)



In 1975, TARF was established in Ishigaki Island, Okinawa. TARF aims to develop agricultural production technologies applicable to developing countries in tropical and subtropical areas, utilizing its subtropical climate conditions.

Liaison Offices (Southeast Asia and Africa)

In 2004, the JIRCAS Southeast Asia Liaison Office was established in Bangkok, Thailand, to serve as a research and communications hub covering the whole of Southeast Asia.

In 2009, the JIRCAS Africa Liaison Office was established in Accra City, Ghana, to serve as a base station for Japanese agricultural researchers in Africa. The office was transferred to Nairobi, Kenya in 2016.


